PROFESSIONAL SKILL SET



Kevin is a local government **education officer** within the school effectiveness service at Medway Council. Here he is being interviewed on radio by local primary school councillors. Entering teaching at the same time as the introduction of the national curriculum in 1989, he has taught in a range of state and international schools. Qualifying as a **headteacher** in 2000, he led two large state schools and **chaired** local authority **policy groups**.

By 2002 he was a headteacher European **representative** of the Royal Opera House and in 2012 he led on establishing the ROHBridge **creative network** amongst primary schools in the local authority. This work developed into a **partnership** between key stakeholders, establishing an *Education Cultural Partnership*. Since joining the local **improvement drive**, he's **co-authored** several leadership programmes. After a successful **bid** to the Department of Education, the impactful *Effective Leadership: Inclusion* (2018) programme saw headteachers visiting prisons to better understand cause and effect of exclusion.

As a **life-long Christian** outside of education, he's a **qualified musician** and leads the music ministry at St Peter's, Walworth. Living with his **modern family** in Rochester, you'll often see him enjoying the delights of the High Street, Cathedral and walking his Rottweiler, Zara.

Collaborates with the PCC mission action planners to effect change due to the growing congregation



Mentors young people to take on roles within the liturgy, expanding the age profile, and embracing three year olds and adults alike



Advises on the *Diddy Disciples* steering group to shape the international use of this resource for children in their early years



Encourages the inclusion of young children with special educational needs in the liturgy and supported adults in their understanding of disability



Nurtures the leadership of lay people to develop their talents, encouraging wider participation in singing and leading worship



Leads the music ministry and created a digital library of backing tracks for online worship throughout the pandemic
